## Person centred transition reviews



## What does person centred mean?

It means focussing on your child and how you can be involved in the process of helping the school and others support your child. It helps services understand how they can support you in the way that's needed.



## What is a person centred review?

### A person centred review is all about:

- listening to the young person's views and wishes
- helping young people to think about how they can progress into adulthood
- getting the best help from everyone who knows the young person. For example, you, the school and other professionals.



## Will it be a formal meeting?

No it's all about involving and engaging. It is an opportunity to bring together everyone who supports the young person and celebrate their achievements as well as discussing any anxieties that they may have about the future.

It is not formal and everyone should feel comfortable to contribute. Everyone will help to form a realistic plan of action for the next year.



The person centred way gives everyone the opportunity to acknowledge and celebrate what is working well and what their role and contribution to this is, as well as looking at what is difficult and not going well. This can then be addressed and results in jointly agreed actions.
